A basic Apple developer account costs 99 USD per membership year. You have three enrolment options:


1. Individual / Sole Proprietor / Single Person Business

You would need:

- Apple ID
- Basic personal information, including your legal name and address.

Contact information (Legal Name, Phone, Address)




2. Company / Organization

You would need:

- Apple ID of organization's owner/founder, executive team member, senior project lead, or have legal authority granted to you by a senior employee.
- D-U-N-S number.
- Your organization must be a legal entity so that it can enter into contracts with Apple. We do not accept DBAs, fictitious businesses, trade names, or branches.

Required fields:


- Verification contact if you aren't owner or founder (First name, Last Name, Job Title, Business email, Phone).
- Organization Information (Legal Entity Name, D-U-N-S number, Website, Phone, Work Email)



3. Government Organization

You would need:

- Apple ID of organization's owner/founder, executive team member, senior project lead, or have legal authority granted to you by a senior employee.
- Your organization must be a legal entity so that it can enter into contracts with Apple. We do not accept DBAs, fictitious businesses, trade names, or branches.


